Membership Regulations



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1. Preamble

Student Council has established the regulations contained herein to outline rights and benefits of members of the Flinders University Student Association. These regulations shall also outline the process of joining and ceasing membership with the association.

2. Definitions

- 2.1 Unless otherwise defined in these regulations, the definitions outlined in section 1 of the FUSA Constitution shall apply to these regulations.
- 2.2 In these regulations;
- '**Admin Staff**' refers to the appointed administration staff working for the Flinders University Student Association;
 - '**Association**' refers to the Flinders University Student Association;
 - '**Constitution**' refers to the Constitution of the Flinders University Student Association as approved by University Council;
 - '**Member**' means a member of the Flinders University Student Association as outlined in the Constitution of the Flinders University Student Association;
 - '**Student**' refers to any enrolled student of Flinders University, whether that person is enrolled as a full-time, part-time or external student;
 - '**Student Council**' refers to the governing body of the Flinders University Student Association; and
 - '**University**' refers to the Flinders University of South Australia.

3. Rights and Benefits of Membership

- 3.1 Benefits of Membership of the Association shall include, but is not limited to;
- a) access to all advocacy services managed by the Association;
 - b) discount at Association run events, and other Association initiatives;
 - c) regular updates about upcoming promotions, prizes and giveaways; and
 - d) eligibility to enter competitions and giveaways through the Association.
- 3.2 Rights of Members shall include, but are not limited to;
- a) attending and voting at a General Meeting of the Association;
 - b) standing for election to Student Council;
 - c) using services, amenities and programs funded from the membership fee (where applicable); and
 - d) inspecting any financial records, policies, procedures, regulations, meeting minutes or the Constitution as outlined in clause 7.4 of the Constitution.
- 3.3 Benefits and rights of membership of the Association are not capable of being transferred or transmitted to another person.



- 3.4 Benefits and rights of membership of the Association terminate upon cessation of the membership.

4. Membership Requirements

- 4.1 Membership of the Association is free and voluntary
- 4.2 Only students may be members.
- 4.3 Members are bound by the Constitution and these regulations.

5. Becoming a Member

- 5.1 The process of becoming a member via the website is;
- a) navigate to the 'Join FUSA' site found at <https://fusa.edu.au/membership/>;
 - b) complete a membership form by submitting the following details;
 - i. student ID number;
 - ii. first name;
 - iii. last name;
 - iv. email address; and
 - c) the Association will then send a confirmation email shortly after welcoming the student to being a member.
- 5.2 The process of becoming a member via offline means;
- a) filling out a membership form and submitting to the Association, ensuring it includes;
 - i. full name;
 - ii. student ID number;
 - iii. signup date;
 - iv. postal address;
 - v. email address; and
 - b) once processed by an admin staff, an email will be sent welcoming the student to being a member of the Association.

6. Termination of Membership

- 6.1 Membership of the Association may be terminated if;
- a) the member stops being a student; or
 - b) the member notifies the Association that they wish to terminate their membership.
- 6.2 A member may notify the Association of their wish to terminate membership either in writing or in person at the Association's Office (Located at Level 1, Student Hub, Sturt Road, Bedford Park SA 5042), and must include their;



- a) full name;
- b) student ID number; and
- c) email address.

7. Register of Members

- 7.1 The Association shall maintain a Register of Members of the Association which records;
 - a) the name, student ID number, email address and postal address of each member of the Association; and
 - b) the date of admission to, and cessation of, membership of each member.
- 7.2 The Register of Members will be kept in a confidential database and will only be accessible by the Association's staff and Student Council for purposes relating to the Association's business.
- 7.3 All membership details will be subject to the University's Privacy Policy.

8. Membership Complaints and Concerns

- 8.1 Members may submit a complaint or concern regarding their membership to any member of Student Council.
- 8.2 Members may submit a complaint or concern regarding their membership to the University by contacting the Manager, Student Engagement.
- 8.3 Members have the right to request in person meetings with the members of Student Council, if their rights as outlined in clause 8.1 of these regulations have been exhausted.
