7. Matters for Decision.

7.1 A Parking Fee Increase?? In This ECONOMY?!!

Preamble

Flinders University has chosen to implement a campus car parking hike from \$200 to \$420 over the next three years. These changes will cause irrefutable damage for many students who chose to study at Flinders in the coming years.

These price increases will unfairly impact students from lower socio-economic backgrounds, those with disabilities, students supporting families, students living in rural areas (or outside of the train lines) as well as all students that are already facing financial strains due to the ongoing effects of the pandemic.

The price increases further discourage student attendance on campus and will risk lower participation in both course work and community culture. This is something which in the aftermath that the pandemic had on students in 2020, the University should actively avoid risking.

Furthermore, these unaffordable increases will put the safety of many of its students in jeopardy, especially those who may then be required to take public transport after-dark.

These increases to parking fees atop the government increase to course fees will only create further economic barriers for students and inevitably hinder accessibility to higher education for students most affected by the pandemic. In the long-term these changes will create significant barriers for many prospective students.



Platform

FUSA acknowledges the extensive negative effects that these price increases will have on Flinders students access to education, safety, and financial stability.

Student Council recognises that FUSA has a primary responsibility to fight for students who are experiencing financial and academic hardship.

Student Council commends the work that has been done by the Executive Committee in the creation of the petition which has allowed upwards of a thousand people to voice their disgust on the price hikes and show their solidarity with the students at Flinders University.

Motion

Student Council directs the Student President, General Secretary, Education Officer, and Welfare Officer to continue to their student-led and public pressure campaign on the University by calling on President and Vice Chancellor Colin Stirling to not only cease the gross parking price hikes but also:

- Implement a concession rate for low-income earners and Health Care Cardholders
- Allocate a minimum of \$50,000 worth of parking permits for students accessing financial assistance through FUSA Student Assist
- Allocate a minimum of \$50,000 worth of financial assistance for students with disabilities who do not qualify for a South Australian disability parking permit.
- Implement a fortnightly direct debit payment option for the annual and semester permits.
- Increase Flinders Loop Bus services after-hours and outside semesters.
- Fight to ensure an increase of regular and after-hours bus services to the University, especially to outer suburbs.

7.2 Employability support campaign Round 2: Electric boogaloo

Preamble

In June 2020, FUSA Student Council approved General Council Member's (Benika Bhoola) motion for the Employability Support Campaign which saw that \$30,000 was allocated to assist students. The remodelling of the existing Development Grants Program allowed for students to receive financial aid when completing qualifications such as First Aid Certificates, RSAs, and other upskilling courses to help boost their employability.

The campaign was originally launched to acknowledge financial difficulties students were facing during the Covid-19 pandemic and was created to help support students when re-entering the workplace as jobs began opening again. The campaign was extremely well received by students but was only open for a short time. There is still an ongoing need for financial support for students looking to upskill in areas to boost their employability. Thus, a reopening of the grants should be considered with a pre-emptive attitude - that if they are once again well received - that there is an opportunity for them to become a permanent fixture at the University.

Motion

Student Council approves that the Employability Grants be reopened on the same basis that they previously were created.

Student Council endorses the Education Officer to work with the Student Representation & Development Officer and Manager, Student Engagement to allocate \$10,000 to be allocated towards the Employability Grant Scheme in each of the first three terms of 2021.

7.3 Terracycle stationary recycling program expansion

Preamble

An essential component of studying is notetaking, and there are recall benefits to manual writing as opposed to digital notetaking. Currently, stationery cannot be recycled kerbside. Students should not have to choose between effective studying and waste reduction. Terracycle is an Australian company that operate recycling programs for difficult to recycle products at a nominal fee per collection box. This program was trialed in the Hub during 2020, and I would like to expand it the Sturt Library, Medical Library, and Tonsley campus.

Action

Student Council approves the expenditure of \$579 from Environment Officer's Initiatives budget to purchase three Small Office Supplies Zero Waste box from Terracycle to be placed at Sturt Library, Medical Library, and Tonsley campus.

7.4 Halt the Parking Fee Increase

Preamble

On January 14th, Flinders University administration made the decision to increase the parking fees for both teachers and student. The planned fee restructure is projected to take place over 3 years, from 2021 to 2023, and displays a significant swelling in price every year (Appendix 4). This fee change represents a substantial increase from the fee structure previously in place and could affect the financial position of students and prevent positive outcomes in their university and personal lives. Furthermore, referring to University of South Australia's (UniSA) current parking fee structure (Appendix 4), when compared to Flinders' proposed parking rates, the Casual maximum fee is less than half of Flinders proposal while the yearly fee of UniSA is considerably lower than that of



Flinders. These changes portray Flinders University as being alarmingly out of step with other comparable institutions within the state in an important aspect of student life.

Motion

Student Council compels FUSA Executive to lobby to Flinders University Administration for a suspension in the proposed restructuring of parking costs and to look for possible alternatives.

Preamble

LGBTQIA+ individuals continue to face discrimination in society. To make the Flinders University campuses a safer place that can proudly and appropriately advocate and support the LGBTQIA+ community, student council members should have further development and training. The Equality Project holds an annual LGBTQIA+ focused conference called the Better Together Conference. In past years, FUSA has supported the participation of these conferences. The Equality Project is holding a master class which is suitable for further development in the Student Council. This year the advocacy master class will be held from 21 March to 23 March in Port Douglas Queensland.

Motion

FUSA approves to spend the amount appropriate from the members of Student Council travel budgets who are seeking to attend the Equality Project's Advocacy Masterclass in Port Douglas, Queensland, including travel and accommodation costs. That all who seek to attend will submit a budget to executive for approval.

7.6 Pauline Hanson You Are Not Indigenous, Please Explain!

Preamble

Currently the position on Student Council that represents and advocates for all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students at Flinders University, is referred to as the 'Indigenous Students Officer' and is referred to as within FUSA's constitution and regulations. The term Indigenous is outdated and is recently being used by members in the far-right conservative movement (i.e. Pauline Hanson), who believe being born in Australia equates to Indigeneity. A more appropriate term that is widely adopted by Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples today is First Nations.

Motion

Student Council accepts the name change of Indigenous Students Officer to First Nations Students Officer, and to be reflected within FUSA's governing documents (i.e. constitution and regulations).

7.7 FUSA Endorses the Uluru Statement from the Heart

Preamble

The Uluru Statement from the Heart was issued to the Australian people in May 2017, following two years of work and a gathering in Uluru to finalise the statement in 2017. The statement calls for structural reform (including constitution change), aiming at establishing a new relationship between First Nations Peoples and the wider nation based on justice and self-determination. Structural reform looks like a First Nations Voice to parliament and a Makarrata Commission to oversee a



process of agreement making and truth-telling. These reforms are: Voice, Treaty and Truth.

Unfortunately 'Malcolm Turnbull' the then prime minister at the time denied the statement, by claiming that it constitutes a third chamber of parliament and again rejected by 'Scomo'. The Uluru Statement movement is still ongoing and support is needed not only by First Nations Peoples, but also the wider community to raise awareness and education around what the statement calls for.

Motion

Student Council endorses the Uluru Statement from the Heart, and distributes (social media and stalls at university events e.g. O'Week) out resources to raise awareness and educate the Flinders University community on what the statement is and calls for

7.8 Employment opportunities for Students with Disabilities

Preamble

After graduation from university, students with disabilities (SWDs) will face multiple layers of disadvantage with regards to employment, compared to students without disabilities. Therefore, it is critical to raise awareness of employers to strengthen employment opportunities for SWDs and provide trainings for SWDs in term of skills preparation for getting a job, including resume, application process, interview skills and soft skills needed by the labour market.

Platform

FUSA recognizes the importance of supporting university students with disabilities to become job ready, for when they graduate.

Motions



The FUSA General Council member will work with FUSDA, an association of students with disabilities in Flinders University to organize a half day-workshop to provide training on job opportunities and skills by experts of local organizations for SWDs in the university. The expenditure for experts, logistics and stationaries is estimated about \$600.

7.10 International student support

Preamble



International students are facing incredible stress and a unique array of challenges during the COVID19 pandemic. Many students have spent their summer isolated from their families and unable to return home, increasing the risk of poor mental health with no end in sight. The COVID19 Pandemic has resulted in loss of employment and financial support for many international students. Students are now facing poor housing conditions, limited income, and relying on emergency financial assistance, local charities and food banks to be able to eat and pay rent. This has resulted in requests for Emergency Financial Assistance at FUSA to jump from 353 in 2019-2020 and as the deadlines for fees approach students will face more and more challenges. Flinders University scholarships available to international students such as the go beyond scholarship. This is currently only eligible to First Year students who are linked to academic performance. It is challenging for students to excel academically if they are going without food and experiencing financial stress. There is limited opportunity for student who are not first years and those whose circumstances have changed due to the pandemic. There are no options for international students to study part time. There is also uncertainty for how long the fee extensions will be available for future semesters, making it difficult for students to plan. Student who have been unable to return to Australia that are enrolled at Flinders University are paying the same fees as if they were on campus. This is despite offshore students not having access to equivalent services, on campus experience, and course and topic options as onshore students.

Motion

FUSA will work with the International Student Officer and International Students to create a Flinders Campaign. FUSA student council supports the #StudyLocalSupportLocal and National Union of Students Let Us back in campaign.

7.11 Transgender Health

Preamble



While the university has been making great strides in making a more gender diverse/transgender inclusive environment, with the addition of things such as preferred names and pronouns; gender dysphoria is still prevalent within many Trans and gender diverse students. Accessing gender affirming products such as binders/ binding tape have presented as inaccessible to most students due to the cost. This financial inaccessibility often forces students to resort to unsafe binding methods to alleviate their dysphoria. Gender dysphoria heavily contributes to a trans-person's mental health which influences their academic performance along with other areas in their personal life. Furthermore, with the Covid19 supplement soon coming to an end, many students will, once again, be forced below the poverty line. Students will be focusing on their fundamental needs to survive, let alone afford access to products which affirm their gender and maintain a healthy wellbeing. By providing healthy gender affirming products to the university's gender diverse community, it prevents students from making sacrifices to their health, thus affecting their academic career.

Motion

Student Council endorses the Queer officer to explore the options for providing financial aid to LGBTQIA+ students to allow them to access gender affirming products.

Executive motions

Preamble

Flinders University has announced a campus car parking price hike from \$200 to \$420 over three years.

This will unequally impact lower socio-economic students, students with disabilities, students with families, and all those already facing financial hardship due to the effects of COVID19. These increases disincentive student attendance on-campus, risking lower participation in both classes and community culture. Making parking unaffordable for many will also significantly jeopardise the safety of students, especially those forced to walk or take public transport after-dark. Increasing parking fees to a cost that many simply can't afford will inevitably hinder accessibility to higher education for those most affected by the pandemic. Manager of Student Engagement Report to Student Council

February 2021

It is with a sense of anticipation I present this first brief report of the year. The Association is in a good position with planning well advanced for the coming year's programs and activities. Unlike most reports, I am not providing direct area by area reports as our staff are currently fully committed with O'Week preparation and Website development in an environment where much time has been lost due to the long period of leave the university has required of us this year. In the March report, you will be provided with more detail around our O'Week outcomes and the usual range of services and programs.

Budget Position

FUSA finished the year in an excellent budget position. On a SSAF Budget of \$2,191,000 expenditure we finished the year 3.5% under budget. This is about as close to the line as is prudent to go, and a marked contrast to many other years where FUSA has significantly underspent, putting at risk SSAF allocations.

This coming year is likely to be more challenging in terms of spending with a slightly lower allocation, and the anticipation of less saving due to covid conditions and fewer staffing vacancies.

Staffing

I am both delighted and sad to announce that two staff are leaving us. Hannah Browne is moving to a management position for an NDIS provider, and Emma Waide is moving to a marketing firm.

Hannah stepped in to undertake advocacy work for us in the middle of Covid lockdown last year at very short notice and has performed admirably in the role. Emma has worked very effectively in the events space since Alex went on Maternity leave. They will both be missed, and we are undertaking recruitment urgently.

O'Week

Effective orientation that creates a welcoming environment for commencing students and meets their needs for information, connection and belonging has been shown to make a significant difference to students engagement and progress in their studies. Our events and Media teams have been working on a greatly expanded Orientation process this year. A significant part of our ethos is "students welcoming students" and students have been heavily involved in the development of the look and feel of Orientation, and will be heavily involved through clubs, collective and other activities through Orientation itself. This year in light of ongoing Covid conditions and the commercial risks involved, we are not running an O'Fiesta, but instead a small music event at the TAV of Friday night.

Website

With several hundred hours lost to the team over the summer period, the new website development has had to take a back seat to O'Week prep recently. Expect to see more in this space in the next report.

Student Representation

Great news for students in the representation space is that the College of Medicine and Public Health has come on board with a Topic Rep program for 2021; this was the last College not to have a

Rep structure in place, and testament to continued growth and outcomes in this area over the last couple of years.

Advocacy

Emergency financial assistance continued over the summer under an arrangement with Anglicare, with moderate demand from students. The year will see a renewed focus on financial counselling and advocacy, as we reach our full staffing complement in this area, and allow Helen to return to more work in the financial area.

Clubs

This year will be a rebuilding year for clubs following a difficult year in covid conditions. Recently restrictions on club gatherings have been eased significantly in time for the new Semester, so clubs will find it easier to run covid safe events and activities.
