

**The Role:**

Course Representatives in EPSW will perform a vital role in ensuring that students have input and a strong voice in decisions that affect them within the College. Using a **partnership approach**, Course Representatives will work collaboratively with academic staff to ensure a broad student perspective is considered across all aspects of course design, delivery and review.

**Benefits & Recognition:**

Course Representative roles provide a unique opportunity to:

- have your voice heard (by channelling broader student views) and enact real change;
- better understand how decisions are made within the College and contribute to those processes;
- further develop your professional skills e.g. networking, negotiation, providing effective feedback;
- make connections and build relationships with staff, students and other influential people; and
- receive points through the Horizon Professional Development Award and a Certificate of Recognition from the University.

**Who:**

Students who are currently enrolled for Semester 1 and 2 in 2022 in an undergraduate or postgraduate degree in the College of Education, Psychology and Social Work.

There are up to three Course Rep positions available for each year level in:

- All Bachelor of Education and Master of Teaching degrees
- Bachelor of Sport Health and Physical Activity (including Outdoor Education focus)
- All Undergraduate and Postgraduate Psychology Degrees
- Both Bachelor and Master of Social Work

To be eligible for a Course Representative role, you **must be enrolled in at least one topic per Semester in the Course/Program (undergraduate or postgraduate) you wish to represent.**

Students with a variety of experiences and backgrounds are encouraged to apply.

**Commitment:**

Course Representatives are expected to liaise with students in their discipline and meet with staff during the semester, including the following:

- Meeting with Teaching Program Directors and other Course Representatives at the Student Course Advisory Committee (twice per semester).
- Opportunity to attend Course Quality Advisory Group (CQAG) meetings including reading papers and liaising with students in your College regarding relevant (and non-confidential) agenda items.

Your term would run from your appointment to 31 December 2022.

**Training:**

You will receive training from FUSA and ongoing support to ensure you know what is expected of you and how to fulfil your role.
